**2.3. Other Hazards** Exposure may aggravate those with pre-existing eye, skin, or respiratory conditions. Therapeutic use has resulted in the following adverse effects: sleepiness, weight gain, increases in serum prolactin, dizziness, weakness, restlessness, increase appetite, swelling of hands and feet, decreased blood pressure when standing, dry mouth and constipation.

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Overdose of the drug has resulted in changes in heart rate and rhythm, slurred speech, reduced level of consciousness ranging from sedation to coma.

## SECTION 4: FIRST AID MEASURES

### 4.1. Description of First Aid Measures

**First-aid Measures General:** In the event of accidental injection, immediately call a poison center or seek medical advice. . Never give anything by mouth to an unconscious person. If you feel unwell, seek medical advice (show the label where possible).

**First-aid Measures After Inhalation:** Using proper respiratory protection, move the exposed person to fresh air at once.

**First-aid Measures After Ingestion:** Rinse mouth. Do NOT induce vomiting. Obtain medical attention.

### 4.2. Most important symptoms and effects, both acute and delayed

**Symptoms/Injuries:** Exposure to large amounts of dust may cause irritation. Causes serious eye damage. Harmful if swallowed. Skin sensitization.

**Symptoms/Injuries After Inhalation:** Dust may be harmful or cause irritation.

**Symptoms/Injuries After Skin Contact:** May cause an allergic skin reaction.

**Symptoms/Injuries After Eye Contact:** Causes severe irritation which will progress to chemical burns.

**Symptoms/Injuries After Ingestion:** This material is harmful orally and can cause adverse health effects or death in significant amounts.

Do not mix with other materials. Vacuum clean-up is preferred. If sweeping is required use a dust suppressant. Use only non-sparking tools.

## SECTION 7: HANDLING AND STORAGE

### 7.1. Precautions for Safe Handling

**Additional Hazards When Processed:** Use only as directed by the information identified in the package insert. Accumulation and dispersion of dust with an ignition source can cause a combustible dust explosion. Keep dust levels to a minimum and follow applicable regulations.

**Precautions for Safe Handling:** Wash hands and other exposed areas with mild soap and water before eating, drinking or smoking and when leaving work. Avoid breathing dust. Handle empty containers with care because they may still present a hazard. Do not get in eyes, on skin, or on clothing. Avoid creating or spreading dust. Keep away from heat, sparks, open flames, hot surfaces. – No smoking.

**Hygiene Measures:** Handle in accordance with good industrial hygiene and safety procedures.
